1. Make your video.
2. Copy it to DVD, and clearly label it with your name and school details.
3. Read the *Terms and Conditions*. By signing the entry form you are agreeing to the *Terms and Conditions*.
4. Complete your entry form and the release forms (see copyright clearance and permissions in *Terms and Conditions*).
5. Either:

- Upload the video and entry forms to www.classnet.com.au (follow the onscreen instructions) – **a teacher will need to register on the site and upload the video for you**. Details on how to register are on the Classnet website.

The Classnet website is designed for viewing videos made by school students. It is aimed at school students and teachers, and adheres to safe cyber practices. It is based in Thornbury, Victoria. Teachers from any school in any country can register.

Some tips

- Choose your equipment carefully. Make sure that your video recorder can work with your DVD editing equipment.
- Learn a few features. You'll need to review how your recording device works. Find out how to start and stop recording, fast forward, rewind, playback and anything else you'll need to know.
- Decide what you want to make a video about. Form a basic idea about your video. Think about who, what and where you'll film.
- Write a short idea of what you want to accomplish.
- Write a script.
- Draw out a storyboard, showing the shots you plan to use.
- Shoot your footage.
- Don't forget that you can use pictures and still shots as well.
- Edit your video. Many cameras are able to edit in limited ways and some have special effects. Learn how to "cut" pieces of your footage together and put music or speech over your video.
- Don't forget to record voiceovers and other sounds as part of your regular footage.
- Remember your overall vision.
